Established in 1885, our trust 'Shri A.P.D. Jain Pathashala, Solapur was one of the oldest educational institutions in India and is a Jain Minority Institute. The trust caters and nourishes the spirit of Shraman Culture and Gurukul education Pattern. Our philosophy is '***Shikshan Haach Dharma'- i.e. Education is Religion***. In addition to running various schools and high schools to impart primary and secondary level education our trust also offers truly global education by providing a broad spectrum of academic environments in the form of courses like B.A., B.Sc., M.A., M.Sc., B.Com., M.Com., M.Phil. and Ph.D. along with professional courses such as D.Ed., B.Ed., B.E., M.E., B.B.A., M.B.A., and M.S.W.

In 1962, our college was inaugurated as Solapur College, Solapur to cater to the needs of higher education in Arts, Science and Commerce faculties. In 1980, the then Solapur College, Solapur was renamed as Walchand College of Arts & Science, Solapur at the hands of former Prime Minister Hon. Shri Atal Bihari Vajpayee to recognize the educational contributions of the great Industrialist late Shriman Sheth Walchand Hirachand Doshi and their family. The college inherits illustrious background of its founding fathers who were people of great eminence in Science, Technology, Social science and Business.
